

Solar power units to be set up in three states

Press Trust of India Baroda: The Department of Non-conventional Sources (DNES) has cleared 30-MW solar power plant in Bhuj town of Kutch district in Gujarat and initiated action of setting up such plants in Abhor town in Punjab and Jodhpur in Mr Maheshwar Rajasthan. Dayal, the Union DNES Secretary, told I'll here that two more locations were being identified in Rajasthan for the purpose Mr Jashwant Mehta. man, Gujarat Electricity Board (GEB), said that GEB would seek financial assistance from the Union Government and DNES for carrying out works on this solar plant in Bhuj The projects' estimated cost was between Rs 95 crore to 100 crore. Mr Dayal said.

Mr Dayal said that a pilot plant had already been set up in New Delhi with a capacity of 50 MW. The design for the plant was indigenous, with only a small portion of the equipment imported, since it could not be produced within the country, he said. Mr Dayal and the cost per unit of power for misolar plant was considerably lower than diesel generators, coal or hydro plants.

Govt to help entrepreneurs for setting up units

Hyderabad: The Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister, Mr N T Rama Rao, on Monday, admitted failure on the part of government in improving the power generation in the state. Speaking at the 71st annual recting of the Federation of

ndhra Pradesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry here he regretted the power cuts imposed in the state and said that it was because the government had no foresight about power crisis and hence had no con tingency plans to meet the pow er shortage. "As we are wholly dependent on power generation through hydei projects we have to face this crisis." he said As per the rule, the ratio of thermal power stations to hydel stations should be 2 1, but it was exactly the opposite in the state. Mr Rama Rao said

In spite of the power crisis, the state government had ade quately ensured uninterrupted power supply to the small-scale units and those affected by the power cuts were the big industries.

The Chief Minister said that the state had abundant was re-

sources which could be used to generate power and for this a capital of Rs 1.50 crore will be needed for every 1 MW unit. He sought the help of industrialists in this regard

Mr Rama Rao said that ever since the Telugu Desam Party came to power, there has been an all-round increase in the number and capital investment of major and medium indus tries He said under the TDP rule there has been 55 per cent increase in industrial units and 57 per cent in the capital. He said that the government would encourage industrialists to set up new units by providing all assistance, including monetary aid, through the various state owned financial institutions. Mr Rama Rao also said that the government had prepared a master plan for the setting up of industrial estates which would have to be developed by the industrial houses. He said that they should ensure the availability of all facilities like cinemas, schools, parks, hospitals, labour quarters and canteens in the estate

Mr Ch Venkateshwar Rao, the

new President of FAPCCI, said that the problems of the industries have remained unsolved in spite of several-representations. He said the major problems faced by the industry was power shortage.


